

## Assistant Development Officer required for Renewable Energy Acceleration Project (REAP)

TBG is developing a community renewable energy project (REAP) in the Fishguard and Goodwick area. Building on the success of our pioneering community wind turbine, we now have Welsh Government funding to develop a range of initiatives, to include:

- Repowering TBG's existing wind turbine
- Sizing and implementing farm-based rooftop solar installations
- Investigating the feasibility of a substantial hydrogen generation project linked to a ground-based solar array
- Engaging local people in initiatives which aim to enable every home, business and community group in the area to access local affordable renewable energy by 2035

An important aspect of our work is to extend renewable energy expertise in our area and this project presents a tremendous opportunity for someone with a basic understanding of renewable energy technology and the aptitude to develop both their theoretical and practical knowledge and skills through employment with us. The trainee development officer will be provided with training, mentoring and networking opportunities to give them the knowledge and experience needed to run a community renewable energy project.

We require someone with a strong commitment to enabling communities develop their own renewable energy resources. The successful candidate will be a fast learner, able to use their own initiative and deal with a wide range of people and organisations e.g. the local authority planning department, contractors and consultants, local farmers and the general public. We expect them to reside, or be prepared to reside in South West Wales. They will be funded for an initial period of 12 months with the strong possibility of follow on funding. We are offering a salary, pro rata to £26,608 pa depending on skills and experience, and flexible hours, which could be from 2.5 days up to 4 days per week, with office and homebased working to suit. We will require references.
